
- City University London a cosmopolitan University in the heart of London

- The University's motto 'to serve mankind'
- 16500 students (13000 full-time equivalents) in 5 Schools (17500 FTEs including validated students)
- \bullet 42% students from over 150 countries (majority from outside EU 27%); 28% staff from nearly 50 countries outside the UK
- 40% students are postgraduates one of UK's foremost providers of postgraduate education


